

School Land Trust Summary

For the 2019-2020 school year, Horace Mann Elementary received \$55,972 with a carry over of \$5,212 for a total amount of \$61,184 in School Land Trust funding. Horace Mann spent \$47,493 on Reading, Math, and Technology goals in the following ways:

- Hire a teacher (.75%) to support our Reading Goal
- Support our Summer Soar Program

Goal #1

67% of the 6th grade students at Horace Mann Elementary will meet the Pathways goal in Acadience according to the Acadience assessment measurement tool. Teachers will progress monitor their students in order to track and monitor student growth using the Acadience progress monitoring system.

The Acadience End of Year Benchmark was the assessment that was going to be used to determine if our goals were met. Unfortunately due to our school dismissal in March 2020, the end of year benchmark was not given to our students and end of year growth data is unavailable.

Goal #2

Horace Mann Elementary will have a 5% increase in the number of students in grades 1-3 who make typical or better progress or meet their benchmark goal in Acadience according to the Acadience assessment measurement tool in the Spring of 2020 as compared to Spring of 2019. The Acadience End of Year Benchmark was the assessment that was going to be used to determine if our goals were met. Unfortunately due to our school dismissal in March 2020, the end of year benchmark was not given to our students and end of year growth data is unavailable.

Goal #3

Students that participate at least 50% of the time in the Summer Soar program will increase their words per minute in reading. At least 50% of students that participate at least 50% of the time in Summer Soar will learn the math facts for their next grade level.

96% of the students who attended at least 50% of the Summer Soar program increased their words per minute in reading.

83% of the students who attended at least 50% of the Summer Soar program learned their math facts for the next school year.

If additional funding was available, we were planning on purchasing technology to help support our students' needs according to our Land Trust goals but were unable to due to school dismissal in March 2020.
